



Dr. Dwight Zscheile, Vice President of Innovation and Professor of Congregational Mission and Leadership at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota. He will speak on living missionally as Jesus' disciples in the world. Tim Leitner will be attending as our delegate. He will be taking a \$300.00 check from OSLC for the offering to the Malagasy Lutheran Church in Madagascar, our companion synod.

In Tattoos on the Heart, he distills his experience working in the ghetto into a breathtaking series of parables inspired by faith.



"A guide to becoming your most courageous self, exploring decisive moments in life and how to respond with clarity and grace."
