2025 CSIS Synod Assembly

The Central/Southern Illinois Synod met on June 5-7 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Bloomington. Dr. Dwight Zscheile of Luther Seminary provided

three keynote presentations on adapting the church to serve in the 21st century.

The assembly adopted the proposed budget for 2026, approved a memorial to the ELCA Churchwide Assembly for a national day of remembrance for Indian boarding schools and passed a resolution on our synod's financial support plan for our companion synods in Madagascar.

The assembly Festival Worship was on June 5 in the sanctuary of St. John's. Bishop Busboom presided, liturgical music for the service was written by Pastor Patrick Jenkins and the worship offering brought in more than \$14,000 for our companion synods in Madagascar!

Pedal for a Purpose raised more than \$5,000 for campus ministry.

The 2026 Synod Assembly will be an experimental one, with an online-only business session in June and "Synod days" of learning, worship, and fellowship in each conference in the fall. The assembly will be an in-person event in 2027.






Homeward Bound: Modern Families, Elder Care and Loss by Amy Zietlow & Naomi Cahn

Homeward Bound shows that as family structure becomes more complex, so too does elder care, and existing institutions and legal approaches are not prepared to handle those complexities. We base our analysis on in-depth, qualitative interviews with surviving grown children and stepchildren whose mother, father, stepparent, or ex-stepparent died. Their stories illustrate the profound ways that the caregiving, mourning, and inheritance process has changed in ways not adequately reflected in formal legal, medical, and religious tools. The solutions center on awareness and preparation: providing more support for individual planning for incapacity and death and, even more importantly, creating legal, political, and social planning for the "graying of America" at a time of increasingly complex familial ties.



Holy Envy: Finding God in the Faith of Others by Barbara Brown Taylor

Barbara Brown Taylor is a New York Times best-selling author, teacher, and Episcopal priest. Throughout Holy Envy, Taylor weaves together stories from the classroom with reflections on how her own spiritual journey has been complicated and renewed by connecting with people of other traditions—even those whose truths are quite different from hers.



Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi by Amy-Jill Levine

Levine reveals the parables' connections to first-century economic and agricultural life, social customs and morality, Jewish scriptures and Roman culture.

When Thoughts and Prayers Aren't Enough: A Shooting Survivor's Journey into the Realities of Gun Violence by Taylor S. Schuman

Taylor invites us to see what it means to be a survivor after the news vehicles drive away and the media moves on. Taylor weaves her own incredible story of survival and recovery into a larger conversation about gun violence in our country.
