No one is forsaken, hear the good news. No one is forgotten, hear the good news.

A familiar hymn, yet often some people may become what I used to call "tone deaf" to God's voice in their life! The wonderful thing is that it takes no "ear training" other than prayer and seeking the presence of God's Spirit in your daily living. Maybe it is in your devotions or maybe in a conversation with another person.

In John 10: 3-4 ³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4 When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice.

How do you recognize and relate to the voices in your life? Maybe friends, parents, children, spouses, or someone else special. I suppose there might be voices you don't want to hear or even dreams that cause sleepless nights, but what about the strength of voices that connect and care for you? I can remember my mother saying to me - "Stephen are you listening to me?" Of course, I would fib and say.... sure! And I really wasn't. Just maybe Jesus in our heart is speaking and says - "are you listening to me?" How might you answer?





We are have purchased new nonfiction books for the church library! We will feature a few each month—here are three books that you may wish to check out:


Strength to Love by Martin Luther King Jr.

In these short meditative and sermonic pieces, some of them composed in jails and all of them crafted during the tumultuous years of the civil rights struggle, Dr. King articulated and espoused in a deeply personal compelling way his commitment to justice and to the intellectual, moral, and spiritual conversion that makes his work as much a blueprint today for Christian discipleship as it was then.



Red State Christians: Understanding the Voters Who Elected Donald Trump by Angela Denker, a Lutheran Pastor

Readers will get an honest look at the Christians who gave the presidency to the unlikeliest candidate of all time. From booming, wealthy Orange County megachurches to libertarian farmers in Missouri to a church in Florida where the pastors carry guns to an Evangelical Arab American church in Houston to conservative Catholics on the East Coast--the picture she paints of them is enlightening, at times disturbing, but always empathetic.
