How Did the Good Samaritan Do It?

We are living in the season of "Thanks-Giving" and "Receiving" as we live and give during the time of Thanksgiving and then Christmas. Family always first, the table laden with wonderful food and sharing stories and memories. Christmas is a time of giving more than receiving. A time to rejoice in happiness felt when gifts, no matter how great or small, touch a heart and bring a smile.

Both are times of giving and receiving which remind me of the compassion and love we share not only with family but also with those who have less or are hurting. No thanks are needed, compassion and thinking beyond self that motives our hearts. I remember as Pastor and family, we invited and brought a lady from a nursing home who was alone for Thanksgiving. Did she "fit in" as they say...not so much, but it was the caring and connection of agape love that counts. This isn't about some approval or getting it right, it is living as Jesus taught.

I'm sure you remember the parable of the Good Samaritan. Samaritans at the time, sometimes of mixed race were not accepted by many and often shunned. This story is why we call the Samaritan "good."

Luke 10:30-37 ³⁰Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to

Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. ³¹Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. ³²So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33 But a Samaritan while traveling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. ³⁴He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. 35 The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend. '36Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" ³⁷He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Care was/is not just so far and no more. Acceptance is not ascertained by who the person might be. It is unreserved compassion. To the innkeeper he said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." Go and do likewise says Jesus.

The Samaritan we call good, could do this because compassion and love when connected with God, knows no boundaries. Thanksgiving and Christmas are a time to truly give thanks by letting go of anything or reason that may keep us apart. Christmas is a time to remember that God's gift of love was born unto us and is meant to reflect that love as we share and give to each other.

There is a hymn entitled: "Songs of Thankfulness and Praise" Verse 4 says: Grant us grace to see thee, Lord, present in they holy word; grace to imitate thee now and be pure, as pure art thou; that we might become like thee at they great epiphany, and may praise thee, ever blest, God in flesh made manifest.

I remember my dad standing by the front door looking out the window waiting for his sons and family to arrive for Christmas. The gift was the joy of being safe and together. I hope Christmas brings joy and sharing wonderful stories. And if you have opportunity show this love and compassion for others...go and do likewise, as Jesus says. That is how the "Good Samaritan" did it...compassion and caring!

I hope everyone received the special mailing with devotional and schedule heading us to the wonderful gift of our Savior, Jesus!


